Focus on Workforce and Recruitment

Dr Alan Stone Module Convenor School of Medicine Cardiff University. Dr Stone addressed the members and stated that there will be an educational hub in Bangor. 20 medical students a year will be recruited and they will use the Cardiff curriculum. He described CARE (care and rural education route). The students will develop more patient centred skills using the Longitudinal Integrated Placements (LIP)

Integrated longitudinal rural placements are designed to promote favourable student attitudes towards and facilitate return to rural practice upon graduation. This model is used in Australia where Dr Stone has visited and if they don't use the LIP model in Australia they lose 25% of their funding. The students are immersed in the local community and based in primary care for a year.

There are two centres one in Bangor and one in Aberystwyth.

GPs in Menai Bridge, Caernarfon, Bethesda and Rhyl will take students on.

Dr Stone stated that they will try to emulate primary care in rural areas of Australia and their model.

Professor Paul Worley of Adelaide South Australia wrote:-

“Purpose Integrated clinical clerkships represent a relatively new and innovative approach to medical education that uses continuity as an organizing principle, thus increasing patient-centeredness and learner-centeredness. Medical schools are offering longitudinal integrated clinical clerkships in increasing numbers. This report collates the experiences of medical schools that use longitudinal integrated clerkships for medical student education in

order to establish a clearer characterization of these experiences and summarize outcome data, when possible. Method The authors sent an e-mail survey with open text responses to 17 medical schools with known longitudinal integrated clerkships. Results Sixteen schools in four countries on three continents responded to the survey.”

Students will be able to follow patients from the surgery to hospital.
Why Bangor? It's a University town, hinterland on the doorstep, water sports, beaches, mountains, great student accommodation.
Dr Stone also spoke about Associate Physicians, who will be able to assist but not replace GPs.

Professor Michael Rees welcomed the announcement that there will be more placements. The plan is to get more local people to deliver training and skills.

Ms Stevie Davies, GP retention and recruitment BCUHB.

Ms Davies is employed by BCUHB to assist and develop a recruitment and retention programme. She is working with practices hosting events and conferences and marketing through social media and a website.

What are the Health Board doing?

There is a recruitment group, offering salaried GP posts, partnership mentoring, work experience posts and funding events.

Professor Michael Rees, Medical Director Workforce and Professionalism Bangor University stated that he had attended a conference regarding Physician Associates, a programme put together by Welsh Government to support GPs. Cardiff has a number of applicants for PA courses for medical students. After two years they graduate and they sit a national examination. Pas cannot prescribe or request radiology they are there to help doctors under supervision.

There is one course in Swansea (15 on it) and one in Bangor (12).

A Physician Associate is paid Band 6 and a Senior PA are paid Band 7.
