2pm Wendy Scrase Primary Care Research and Development Facilitator. **Primary Care Research.**

Mrs Scrase described the Health and Care Research Wales organisation, which comprises several elements of infrastructure and funding schemes and is funded and overseen by Welsh Government. PiCRIS promotes research involvement and has access to support and training. In 2014-15 80 practices were awarded funding and in 2015-16 98 practices. Practices can access training and mentorship which helps with revalidation.

Three year membership costs £250 to then work towards being a Research Accredited Practice.

2.20pm Mrs Mary Popplewell, Assistant Director Risk and Assurance Standards of Business Conduct Framework Policy BCUHB.

Mrs Popplewell addressed the members and explained the facts regarding code of conduct of GPs and distributed the Draft Conduct Framework Policy and guidance on receiving gifts and hospitality.
